

Professor Catherine Boone received her B.A. from the University of California at San Diego and Ph.D. from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT). ••She specializes in comparative politics, with an emphasis on theories of political economy and economic development.

She has conducted research on industrial, commercial, and land tenure policies in West Africa, where her work has been funded by the Social Science Research Council, Fulbright, the World Bank, the Harvard Academy for International and Area Studies, and the American Council of Learned Societies. Her current research focuses on territorial politics and rural property rights in contemporary Africa.

Prof. Boone is a member of the Executive Committee of the Comparative Politics Section of the American Political Science Association (APSA). She has served as a member of the Africa Regional Advisory Panel of the Social Science Research Council, and as Secretary of the African Politics Conference Group, an APSA-affiliated research network. She served on the Executive Council of APSA and is a Founding Board Member and Past-President West Africa Research Association, which oversees the West African Research Center in Dakar, Senegal. ••

She is author of *Merchant Capital and the Roots of State Power in Senegal, 1930-1985* (Cambridge, 1992), which was a finalist for the African Studies Association Herskovitz Award in 1993, and *Political Topographies of the African State: Rural Authority and Institutional Choice* (Cambridge, 2003), which was a finalist for the Herskovitz Award in 2004, a runner-up for the Leubbert Award in 2004, and winner of the Society for Comparative Research Mattei Dogan Award in 2005. She is also the author of of articles and reviews appearing in *Comparative Politics*, *Comparative Political Studies*, *Journal of Development Studies*, *World Development*, *African Economic History*, *Africa Today*, *American Anthropologist*, *African Affairs*, *African Studies Review*, *Journal of Commonwealth and Comparative Politics*, and the *Journal of Modern African Studies*, and several book chapters.

Prof. Boone has been Visiting Fulbright Professor, Beijing Foreign Studies University, People's Republic of China; Visiting Professor and Researcher, Centro de Investigación y Docencias Económicas (CIDE), Mexico City, Mexico; Visiting Fulbright Scholar at the Centre Ivoirien de Recherche Economique et Sociale (CIRES), Abidjan, Côte d'Ivoire; and Visiting Researcher at the Centre Des Etudes Supérieures en Gestion, Dakar, Sénégal. ••
