# The Value Proposition

- APSA regards Related Groups as an essential component of the association contributing to member engagement, professional development and intellectual pluralism.
- Related Groups offer a terrific opportunity to support members with similar interests whose numbers are smaller than sections.
- As we will discuss, some Related Groups have transitioned to an MOU status but we believe should not substantively change the relationship of a Related Group to APSA.

# Current Related Group Policy:

- Passed by APSA Council in 2019, the policy brought the following changes to Related Groups:
  - Each group is required to have a set of bylaws on file with APSA
  - Related Groups were added to the APSA database
    - A membership requirement of 35 active APSA members
    - Chairs have the ability to download their member roster
    - Groups can now utilize APSA Connect
  - An updated panel allocation formula
  - Any anticipated changes to the policy will be communicated to Related Groups.

- **August 31 – September 3, 2023:** 119<sup>th</sup> APSA Annual Meeting – Los Angeles, CA

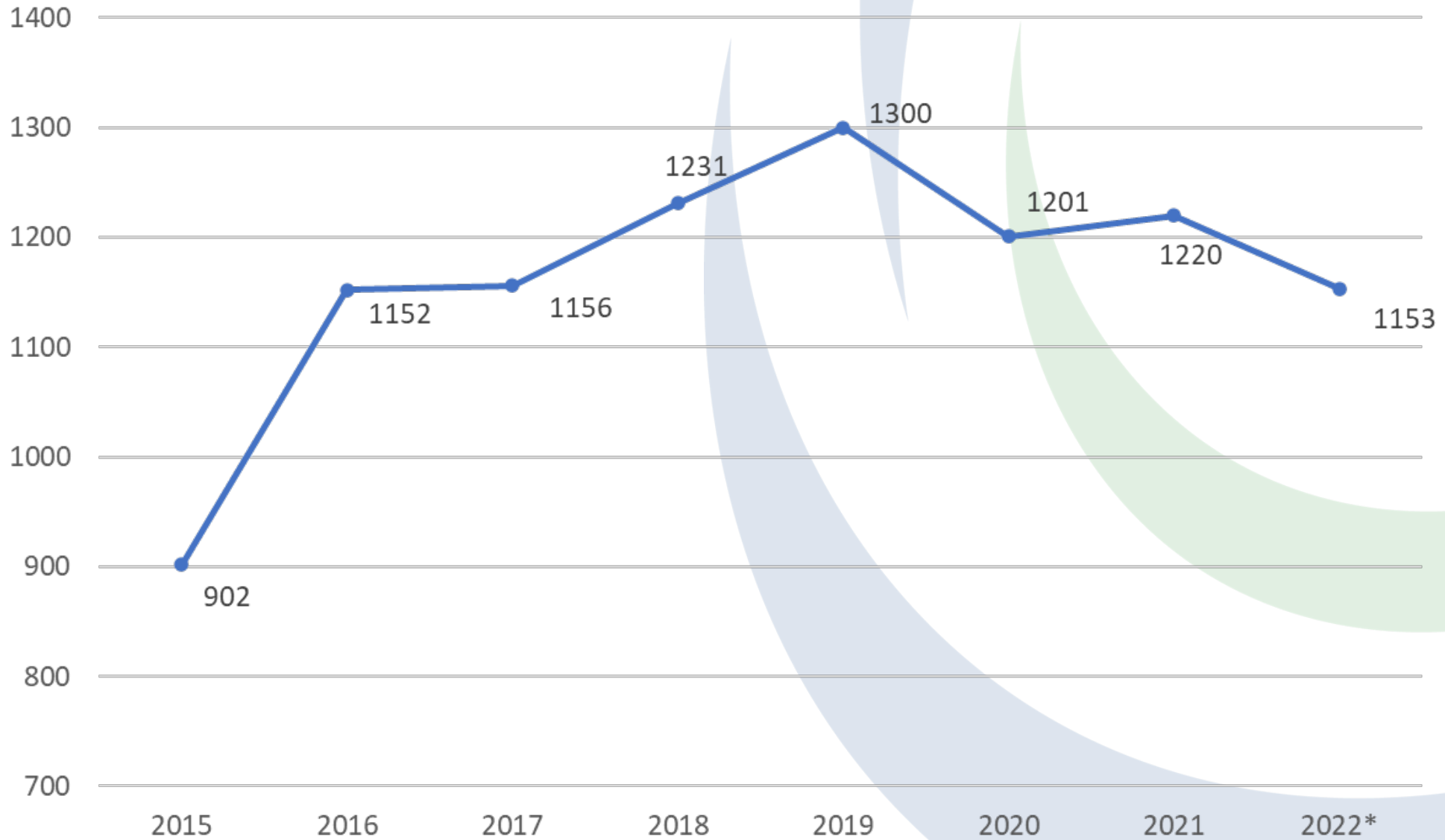
# Related Group Panel Allocations

- Related Group panel allocations are based on Related Group panel attendance as a proportion of total panel attendance, capped at 11% of Division panels
- Submissions will be included as a factor in allocations moving forward
  - 80% on attendance and 20% on submissions
    - Allocations based on panel attendance adjust for panel time-slot when measuring attendance
    - Allocations based on submissions use current-year data to adjust for submission levels for that year
- 2022 attendance will be used to determine 2023 panel allocations

# Available Session Proposal Types

- Paper
- iPoster
- Full Panel (paper panel) (90 min)
- Roundtable (90 min)
- 30-minute Paper Presentations (3 papers at 30 minutes each; 90 min)
- Café (90 min)
- Workshop (4 hours)
- Mini-conference (full day)
- Author(s) Meet Critics (90 min)

# Participation Rules

- Participation is limited to two roles with a maximum of one paper author role
  - Author or co-author presentations only include actual paper presentations (appearing as non-presenting co-author does not count against limit)
  - Non-author appearances include appearance on a non-paper panel (e.g. roundtable); appearing as a discussant or chair does not count against limit
