

August 1st: eJobs Signaling!

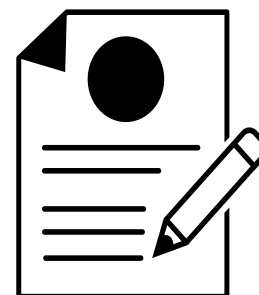
APSA's **Signaling Initiative** streamlines the job search by connecting jobseekers and employers, fostering networking and meeting opportunities. Annual Meeting Signals will **open** for jobseekers **August 1** and close on **August 15**. Employers will receive signals the following week, by **August 20**.

How does signaling work?

1. Register on eJobs

Jobseekers must be an active APSA member to send signals. To join or renew your membership, you can visit apsanet.org/membership/apsa-membership/.

Employers do not need to register or sign up for signals beyond creating a posting on eJobs. Posting a position on eJobs allows a department to receive signals.



2. Signal Interest

Jobseekers may signal up to three (3) institutions between **August 1** and **15**. Each signal consists of the jobseeker's eJobs ID number and a brief message of interest. Signals are confidential. *While signals can be sent to any participating departments on eJobs, we encourage jobseekers to send signals to institutions that are participating in Interview Services at the Annual Meeting.*

Employers will receive their signals, aggregated by the Research Department, by **August 20**. Employers are encouraged to reach out to the candidates that have signaled their interest.

Both jobseekers and employers can use the eJobs platform to see who will be attending the Annual Meeting.



3. Meeting Opportunity

While eJobs signals don't guarantee an interview, they're a useful way for **jobseekers** to show interest in a position or employer, and also provide **employers** with valuable information about candidates interested in meetings.

APSA understands that not all positions are posted and not all position preferences are known by the Annual Meeting. We encourage participants to make use of their signals for those institutions that will be attending.
